Rules & Regulations

- 1. All entries must be sent to the WSU/Clark County Extension Office by 5pm, the last working day of June, 2024. No late entries will be accepted no exceptions.
- 2. ASTM-SEI #1163 approved helmets are mandatory for all exhibitors.
- 3. Showmanship is mandatory for every horse and rider. Prequalifying is mandatory for trail.
- 4. Member can only enter a class one time.
- 5. State Fair participants:
 - a. Must use the same horse they qualified on at the Clark County Fair Division for the State Fair Class.
 - b. Can only enter in classes they participated in at the Clark County Fair.
 - c. Must attend or be represented at the mandatory state team meeting to complete paperwork
- 6. Refer to the most current copies of Washington State 4-H Equine Program Rule Book and the Clark County Washington 4-H Horse Project Supplemental Rule Book
